

STUDENT EMERGENCY FUND

The SUNY Orange Student Emergency Fund helps SUNY Orange students whose lives have been disrupted by unexpected, unforeseen, and unavoidable emergency expenses.

Over 200 students assisted

Danielle was a part-time pre-Nursing student in the process of separating from her husband when she fell behind on her bills. She was already taking care of her two children and gained custody of her sister when her mother passed away in 2019. Danielle needed help catching up and the Student Emergency Fund was able to help her and her family get back on track.

The SUNY Orange Foundation is honored to have received annual grants of \$10,000 from the **Dyson Foundation for four years** in a row to help students who are struggling financially with tuition, books or child care. We appreciate their partnership and our students greatly appreciate their support.



GRANT IN AID

In addition to scholarships, the SUNY Orange Foundation provides financial assistance to students who need help with tuition and books through its Grant in Aid program.

Over \$60,000 in assistance awarded since 2018

Thinking Outside the Box to Better Serve the Community



\$50,000 to hire consultants to research and develop the new Orange County FoodTEC Program, and food and hospitality workforce development opportunity on the Newburgh campus.

\$25,000 to support the new SUNY Orange Cares Program which combines the financial support of our existing Student Emergency Fund with the ability to address food insecurity through gift cards and on-campus meal vouchers, on-campus access to support services from our community partners, financial literacy training and career services support provided by SUNY Orange alumni. This new wraparound program provides a single place for students to access the help they need to stay in school, finish their degree, get a better job and become more financially secure.





\$11,000 to fund the annual Summer Equal Opportunity Program which provides access, academic support and financial aid to students from disadvantaged backgrounds who show promise for succeeding in college but who may not have otherwise attended.

\$15,000 provided through a generous donor to purchase new Chromebooks for the SUNY Orange Technology Loan Program when all classes went virtual.





\$10,000 to support campus visits for prospective students, including transportation, food and takeaways to encourage future communication.

\$10,000 annually to help provide funding for Student Peer Advisors who work in close cooperation with staff of the Academic Advising Office to provide a high level of service to SUNY Orange students by helping them connect to and utilize campus resources.





\$10,000 annually to support the Student Ambassador **Program** which employs current students to work with prospective students and their families, sharing valuable insight and information regarding all that happens at SUNY Orange.

The SUNY Orange Foundation provides an average of \$1.2M in support to SUNY Orange annually.

Healthcare Education: Healing Our Community Since 1952

RISING TO MEET THE NEEDS OF OUR NURSING STUDENTS

- In 1952, Orange County Community College became a leader in the exciting evolution of nursing. The College was chosen to open the first associate degree program in nursing education in the United States.
- Today, this innovative program features the latest in simulation technology which provides SUNY Orange students with the scientific knowledge and resources needed to examine and address health and illness in today's healthcare environment.



HOW SUNY ORANGE STUDENTS RESPONDED DURING COVID

- SUNY Orange Nursing 2 students gained valuable experience during the COVID-19 pandemic. They were there as Orange County teamed with Montefiore St. Luke's Cornwall Hospital to facilitate a vaccine Point of Dispensing (POD) at Kaplan Hall on the College's Newburgh campus.
- More than 1,100 vaccines were distributed throughout the day, and SUNY Orange students were in the middle of the action as they administered vaccines while working with Montefiore staff to process patient paperwork and keep folks moving through the process.
- In the 2022 Nursing School Almanac, the SUNY Orange Nursing Programs on both campuses were ranked in the top twenty of the "Best Associate's Degrees in Nursing in New York". This ranking is based on the stellar performance of our students on their NCLEX-RN exams, with a 93.4% first time pass rate on the Newburgh campus and 92.4% first-time pass rate on the Middletown campus.

The SUNY Orange Foundation raised \$65,000 in 2020 to help purchase a new Human Patient Simulator for the Nursing Department.

Through special event income, grants and the generosity of our donors, the Foundation has contributed to SUNY Orange's legacy of excellence in healthcare education.

Who Are Our Students?

- We are proud to have such a diverse student population. 22.6% of our students are Hispanic, 13.2 % are Black and 2.9% are Asian.
- **SUNY Orange is designated as a Hispanic-Serving institution,** with bi-lingual employees in both the Admissions and Financial Aid areas to help our students navigate the college entry process.
- Thanks to a Title V Grant, PROSPERAR: Moving Students from Surviving to Thriving Program at SUNY Orange is designed to transform the educational environment for our students. Through the redesign of programs and services, PROSPERAR closes equity gaps and delivers significant increases in student achievement, persistence and retention, especially for Hispanic and low-income students.
- 30% of SUNY Orange students go on to continue their education at a 4-year school.
- Pre-COVID, roughly 50% of all students self-identified as first-generation college students.
 Post-COVID, that number has dropped to 30% which is indicative of the impact of COVID on the educational dreams and goals for our students.
- 27.5% of our students are over the age of 24 and 60% are female.
- 47.4% of our students can only attend school part-time because of financial restraints, family obligations or the need to work full-time.

70% of all SUNY Orange students receive some type of financial aid.
